

The Delaware Department of Education (DDOE), in conjunction with the state's geospatial education community, encourage Delaware middle (grades 4-8) and high school (grades 9-12) students to compete in Esri's 2024 ArcGIS StoryMap competition.

To participate in the competition, students must tell a map-based story about Delaware using Esri's StoryMap web application. Students can explore local and/or statewide topics.

Delaware's top five middle school and top five high school submissions will be awarded cash prizes. Winning submissions will be featured on the DDOE competition website. The top middle school and high school submissions will represent Delaware in the national competition.

National winners earn a trip to the Esri Education Summit in San Diego, CA.

Delaware Student Participation:

Esri's 2024 ArcGIS webapp competition is open to students in the United States who have learned to analyze, interpret, and present data via an ArcGIS StoryMap or web app.

Entering the Contest:

- Each school can submit up to five entries.
 - Entered by an individual student or a team (maximum 2 students per team).
- Entries for the state level must be submitted by May 3, 2024.
 - Entries will be judged by GIS professionals in Delaware.
